Program Requirements

To be eligible, adults must be:

- A York County resident
- 60 years of age or older
- Agreeable to a negotiated rate of at least minimum wage

To be eligible students must:

- Be a York County resident
- Be in 7th – 12th grade
- Complete an application with parental signature
- Have application signed by school guidance counselor

Applications for homeschool students are also available.

How It Works

Rent-A-Kids' are geographically matched with older adults. The older adult and youth are required to screen each other. The youth's parents are encouraged to be involved, especially at the start of the discussion.

Many matches continue for several years beginning while the youth is still in middle school and continuing through high school.
