Eagle Lacrosse Club

The Eagle Lacrosse Club was formed in 2009 by a small, but dedicated group of parents. These parents loved watching their sons play lacrosse, but were tired of driving their children to other local lacrosse clubs in order to allow them to play "the fastest game on two feet".

During the 2010 / 2011 lacrosse season Eagle Lacrosse fielded U11, U13 and U15 boy's teams and combined with a couple other local clubs to offer Elementary and Middle School girl's lacrosse. During their inaugural season Eagle Lacrosse had 54 local children participate.

For the 2011 / 2012 season Eagle Lacrosse saw some strong growth that allowed the club to field U9, U11, U13 and U15 boy's teams and once again combine with other local clubs to offer both Elementary and Middle School girl's lacrosse. Their numbers increased to 94 participants.

As the Eagle Lacrosse Club starts to prepare for the 2012 / 2013 lacrosse season they are poised to add a high school level club option to both the boys and the girls programs. Their numbers continue to grow and interest in the lacrosse program continues to soar.

We are now seeing Eagle Lacrosse players make All-Star teams. They are playing on travel teams over the summer, tournament teams during the fall, and indoor teams during the winter. Several players have started attending lacrosse camps and most of the players seek out clinics.

This December two Eagle Lacrosse players will be traveling to Wesley Chapel, FL with Black Dog Lacrosse (an elite level travel team) to participate in the 'Dicks Sporting Goods – Tournament of Champions'

By stressing solid team work, good sportsmanship and the basic R.O.O.T.S. principles (see below) Eagle Lacrosse intends to help the children of the Dover Area strive for

excellence both on and off of the lacrosse field. Through the sport of lacrosse they hope to instill the principles of honesty, integrity and the importance of a strong sense of community pride.

*****R.O.O.T.S stands for*****

- R** = we refuse to bend the **rules** to win.
- O** = a worthy **opponent** is a gift that brings out our best.
- O** = we show respect even when we disagree with the **officials**.
- T** = we never do anything to embarrass our **team** or our club.
- S** = we live up to our own **standards** even when others do not.

The Eagle Lacrosse Club is currently looking for players, coaches, volunteers and local businesses interested in helping to take Eagle Lacrosse to the next level. They will be offering some free clinics this fall and are currently planning to hold registration starting in November.

NEW MEDICARE CHANGES FOR AMBULANCE SERVICE:

On April 12, 2012, Medicare cut benefits paid for ambulance service. What this means is Medicare will only pay for an ambulance transport that is "Medically Necessary". Medicare will ONLY pay for life threatening transports such as breathing problems, chest pain and etc. A transport must require an EMT's services during transport and must be life threatening. If your

condition will allow you to go by other means of transportation without it being a life altering threat to your health, Medicare will decline to pay and the charge will be billed to the patient.

If Medicare declines to pay the bill, your secondary insurance will not cover it either. What this means to you is a \$390 out of pocket expense.

One thing hasn't changed, Dover Ambulance will transport anyone who needs to go to the hospital but if you are on Medicare we must advise you of the NEW changes.

SNOW PLOWING

Winter will soon be here and I would like to remind you about snow removal requirements.

It is our policy to PLOW SNOW CURB TO CURB to the best of our ability! Whenever snow is forecast, we encourage residents to move your vehicles off the streets to allow us to completely clear the streets for your safety. Also, it is best to wait until the snowplow clears your area before shoveling to avoid having your driveway plowed shut again.

Dover Borough Zoning Ordinance, Section 135-1 "requires the owner, occupant or tenant to remove snow and ice from the sidewalks and walkways in front of and alongside of their property to a width of not less than 2 feet within 8 hours after the snowfall ceases". Snow is not to be placed in the streets,

alleys, crosswalks or around fire hydrants. In addition, please spread an ice melt product on the sidewalks to keep them safe for pedestrians and our mail carriers.

SNOW EMERGENCIES - We will be declaring snow emergencies during the winter months whenever 4 inches (or more) of snow is predicted. **This requires you to park all vehicles off the street.** Snow emergencies will be announced on local TV and radio stations. (TV – WGAL, Fox 43, WHP TV 21; Radio – WGTU 107.7 FM, WGET 1320 AM)

The following are common violations of Dover Borough's zoning ordinances -

TREES & SHRUBS –

All trees and shrubs along walkways and roadways must be kept trimmed to a height of not less than 10 feet above sidewalks and 14 feet above streets. They also should not obstruct the walking area of sidewalks or street lights.

BUILDING MAINTENANCE –

To keep the borough looking nice there is a building maintenance ordinance which requires property owners to keep the exterior of the property in good repair. (i.e. – no peeling paint, stairs, doors, porches must be maintained to prevent hazards, loose or hanging siding or downspouts, broken windows).

Properly maintained buildings enhance the community and help maintain property values in the area.

NUISANCES –

ALL PETS must be kept on your property, unless they are on a leash. The office has been receiving numerous complaints about cats running free.

If you have zoning or code enforcement questions or complaints please call the office. All complaints are confidential.

WATER CONSERVATION TIPS

The Borough Office frequently receives requests from residents asking how they can reduce water usage to reduce their bills. Here are some tips to help you -

Usage tips

- Turn the water off while brushing your teeth, shaving and washing your hands. This will save an average of 5 gallons per week.
- Limit the time you shower. Set a timer to remind you. On average, a quick shower will save 5+ gallons of water (over taking a bath) when the time is limited.
- Install flow restrictors on faucets.
- Don't wash dishes with the water running. Instead use both sides of the sink: one side to wash and one side to rinse.
- Don't let water go down the drain when there may be another use for it, such as when running water waiting for it to get hot – catch this water and use it for watering plants, pets or cleaning around your home. Use rinse water from washing dishes to mop.
- Don't flush the toilet every time it is used. Follow the old

adage "If it's yellow let it mellow, if it's brown flush it down. This will save 5 gallons per flush.

Check for leaks – Are any faucets dripping or toilets running? A leaking toilet can use over 200 gallons per hour or over 4,000 gallons per day! To test your toilet for leaks put several drops of food coloring in the tank. If any of the dye appears in the bowl your toilet is leaking. When you are sure no one will be home using water for several hours, write down the reading on the water meter. When you return home, check the meter again to see if the reading has changed. If the reading has changed, you have a leak.

Appliances - Toilets, washing machines and dishwashers use the most water.

- Replace your old 5 gallon toilets with new ones which use less than 2 gallons per flush.
- Replace old washers. New models use 35% to 50% less water and half the electricity.
- When using the washer be certain the load is set for the correct size, or only wash a load when you have a full load.
- Only run the dishwasher when it is full.



TRASH, BULK ITEM & RECYCLING

The normal trash day is Monday year round. In addition, June 1 through September 30 trash is also collected Thursdays. You may put out up to six cans or bags (or a combination of the two) each collection day.

Bulk items and recycling are only collected on the year round day of the week (Mondays). Items for recycling should be put curbside **inside the recycling bin** for them to be collected. The recycling truck will not collect recyclable items that are bagged or bundled and sitting with the regular trash. Additional copies of the allowed items can be obtained from the office or on the website. If your recycling bin is lost or breaks, come to the Borough office to get a new one.



If a holiday falls on a regular trash collection day, the collection for the week is one day later. For example, Memorial Day and Labor Day are on Mondays, which is our normal trash day. Trash will be collected on Tuesday.

REMINDER – Our ordinance states that **GARBAGE CANS must** be stored out of sight (i.e. - in the side or rear yard, behind the front corner of the house). Please do not put your trash at the curb for collection before 6pm the night before and take the empty cans away from the curb on the day of collection.

Please write your address on your recycling bin and trash cans. They tend to blow around on windy days and without an address, they cannot be returned to you in a timely manner.

NEW E-Cycle Law for 2013:

Starting January 24, 2013, PA's **Covered Device Recycling Act** prohibits all PA solid waste disposal facilities from accepting televisions, desktop and laptop computers, computer monitors and computer peripherals (anything that connects to a computer such as a mouse, keyboard, printer, etc.), and also prohibits residents from placing them at the curb for waste pick-up. **Under the Act, your waste hauler will NOT pick up these electronic devices.**

But we'll recycle them for FREE.

It's not just the law, it's the **RIGHT** thing to do.
