<u>Utility Poles and Signs</u>: Utility poles are not bulletin boards. Posting signs on utility poles is not permitted in Dover Borough or Dover Township. Staples, nails, and tacks pose a danger to the line workers. Any signs attached to utility poles will be removed.

<u>Signs on the Square</u>: Organizations that wish to post signs promoting events must contact the Borough office to schedule. Yard and garage sale signs may not be placed on the square. Unauthorized signs may be removed.

<u>House Numbers-</u> Help first responders help you. Dover Borough ordinance 73-1 and 2, requires buildings to be identified with address numbers. The numbers should be displayed prominently on the front of Borough homes. The numbers should be a minimum of 3 inches tall, be a contrasting color from the immediate background, and be visible from the opposite side of the street.

Property maintenance as the seasons transition

<u>Grass/Weeds/Trees:</u> Remove grasses or weeds from the sidewalk and curb adjacent to the property, including weeds at street level at the curb. Grass clippings should not be blown into the streets because they can clog storm drains.

Leaves: The Borough does not have leaf pick up. Do not rake your leaves to the curbs or sidewalks. Penn Waste will pick up leaves that are bagged and securely closed. Please rake any leaves, weeds, or debris off the storm grates to facilitate drainage. If you notice a problem and are physically unable to clear the grate, please contact the office to alert us to the problem.

Snow Removal: Property owners /occupants must clear a two-foot-wide path on snow/ice covered walkways and sidewalks within 8 hours after the snowfall has stopped. If snow fall stops after 6 p.m., snow/ice must be removed by 9 a.m. the next day. Areas around fire hydrants should also be cleared. Snow cannot be thrown into the street.

Snow Emergency: Snow emergencies will be announced on our website, WGAL-8, ABC27, WPMT43, CBS21, and on Radio 107.7 WGTY. The information is shared with SPIN (Southern Pennsylvania Incident Network) on Facebook. In a snow emergency, all vehicles must be removed from designated snow emergency routes, or they will be subject to fines and/or towing at the owner's expense. Additionally, all vehicles driving on snow emergency routes during a declared emergency must be equipped with snow tires and or chains.

<u>Water Discharge</u>. Please remember that connecting sump pumps, roof drains, or other similar connections to the sewer system are illegal and are subject to a fine of \$1000 for each day an illegal connection remains. Please contact the Borough office with any questions or for a no-cost inspection to ensure that your property complies with Borough ordinances.

Emergency Preparedness. Are you prepared if an emergency required you to evacuate your home? Create an emergency "go bag" by placing the following items in a backpack: plush throw, small flashlight, travel kit with toothbrush, large lantern flashlight, water bottle, scrubby to wash face and hands, medication, and chargers for your tech devices. Any other items that might make you more comfortable while away from your home.

<u>Water Leaks</u>: Water leaks can be expensive and result in thousands of gallons of water being wasted daily, if you think you may have a water leak, check these areas where leaks commonly occur: showers and tubs, toilets, sinks, dishwashers, water heaters and outside spigots.
