If we are unable to reach you by phone regarding a suspected water leak, a problem with your water meter, or a need to make an appointment to replace a meter battery, it will hinder our ability to resolve these issues in a timely manner.

**Water Bills:** Mail delays do occur. Please be advised that *Failure to receive a water bill does not void responsibility for its payment or waive the past due penalty. Billing dates are March 1, June 1, September 1, and December 1 and are due within 30 days.*

**House Numbers-** Help first responders help you in the event of an emergency. Dover Borough ordinance 73-1 and 2, requires buildings to be identified with address numbers. The numbers should be displayed prominently on the front of Borough homes, be a minimum of 3 inches tall, be a contrasting color from the immediate background, and be visible from the opposite side of the street. Noncompliance could result in a fine of not more than \$600.

**PARKING:** Cars must be parked with traffic. Cars that are parked against traffic can be fined. Additionally, Ordinance 152-2 states that trailers, semitrailers, boats, campers, tractors or tractor-trailer combinations cannot be parked on any street, alley or highway in Dover Borough.

**Trash issues-** Trash cans/bags should not be placed curbside until Sunday night. Trash should be secured, bags tied shut and put into trash cans. Loose trash should not be put out to prevent it from being scattered on the street. Rechargeable batteries should not be placed in the trash or recycling.

**Recycling-** Recycled items should not be placed in plastic bags in the recycling bin). These items **SHOULD BE** recycled: plastics (numbers 1,2 and 5), clean and dry newspapers, flattened cardboard, cartons (milk and juice), glass bottles and jars, steel & aluminum cans. These items **SHOULD NOT BE** placed in recycling bins: packing material (bubble wrap, styrofoam peanuts, plastic packing pillows, foam packaging inserts), medical waste, plastic bags, clothing, linens, small appliances, extension cords, foil products (includes aluminum foil, and foil serving trays), food, liquid, shredded paper, wood, building materials, and electronics (tv's, computers, etc). **Grass/Weeds/Trees:** Property owners/occupants are responsible to maintain lawns and remove grasses and weeds, including weeds at street level at the curb, and in the sidewalk. Grass clippings should not be blown into the streets where they could clog storm drains. Trees, bushes, and other vegetation may not protrude over or overhang sidewalks. A minimum ten-foot vertical clearance from the sidewalk is required.
