Permits- Before beginning any property renovations or construction, contact the office to determine if the work requires a permit.

Electronics recycling news: Penn Waste does not accept electronics. However, *Reworld* and *Goodwill Keystone Area* have joined forces to provide free electronic waste recycling. Items for recycling can be taken to the local Goodwill stores at 965 Loucks Rd, York and 1120 Roosevelt Ave, York. **Accepted Items**: computers, monitors, keyboards, mice, printers, scanners, all-in-one-devices, networking equipment, VCR/DVD/Blu Ray plyers, gaming systems, stereos, radios, MP3 players, telephones, mobile devices, cameras, video cameras, televisions, cable or set top boxes, toasters, vacuum cleaners, cables, electronic wiring, answering machines. **Unacceptable Items:** loose batteries and bulbs, smoke detectors, hazardous household waste, refrigerators, ranges, water heaters, freezers, unit air conditioners, washers and dryers, devices containing either mercury or freon.

Rechargeable Batteries Do Not Go into Your Trash or Recycling: Rechargeable batteries require proper disposal when they are no longer usable. When subjected to intense pressure in trucks or at the facility, these batteries combust and ignite, causing fires. Keep rechargeable batteries out of your curbside trash and recycling bin and dispose of them properly. Visit <u>www.call2recycle.org</u> for a listing of collection sites for these potentially hazardous batteries. NOTE: Household alkaline batteries like Eveready, Duracell (AA, AAA, 9-volt, C, or D sizes) can go in your regular trash. Construction materials: Penn Waste will **NOT** take construction materials. Residents must find another means of disposal and should not place those items curbside for trash collection.

Recycling/ Trash Concerns: DO NOT place recycled items in plastic bags because they clog the Penn Waste's equipment. More information is available at on the Penn Waste website: www.pennwaste.com.

Vehicle Nuisances: Vehicles that are unable to move on their own power, do not have a current registration and current inspection sticker, or have physical defects may not be parked within

the Borough. Examples of physical defects are broken windshields, flat tires, or missing body parts. A complete list of specific defects can be found in the Borough Code.

Grass/Weeds/Trees: Property owners/occupants are responsible to maintain lawns and remove grasses and weeds, including weeds at street level at the curb, and in the sidewalk.

Leaves: The Borough does not have leaf pick up. Penn Waste picks up bagged leaves. More information on handling yard waste can be found at <u>www.ycswa.com/services/waste-</u><u>dispsal/yardwaste/.</u>. Please rake any leaves, weeds, or debris off the storm grates to ensure proper drainage. If you see a problem and are physically unable to clear it, please contact the office.

Snow Removal: Property owners /occupants must clear a two-foot-wide path on snow/ice covered walkways and sidewalks within 8 hours after the snowfall has stopped. Snow **cannot** be thrown into the street. If snow fall stops after 6 p.m., snow/ice must be removed by 9 a.m. the next day. A 3- ft. area should be cleared around fire hydrants also.

Fireworks: Even though it is legal to buy certain fireworks in PA, there are state laws restricting their use. Fireworks **may not** be set off within Dover Borough. The proximity of the houses and buildings pose a fire danger.
